Local theater junkies were rescued in 1995 by Summer Shorts programming! Susan 'Susi' J. Westfall founded City Theater with a passion for original plays and theater. Each year, devotees of the 24 seasons anticipate the newest collection of Shorts' plays.

Entertainment with provocative beginnings, dramatic endings and succinct dialogue throughout amuses in the 10-minute timeframe. Humor chortles through the audience as they appreciate the plays curated by Artistic Director, Margaret M. Ledford. She and 25 fellow critics read 800-1,000 submitted works. After much thought to content variety and audience appreciation the final eight are selected. The titles themselves intrigue: Franklin PIERCE: Dragon Slayer, heroine, 8th grader Jennifer assigned a lack-luster president for her essay. Book and Lyrics authored by Off, Off Broadway writer Preston Max Allen. Big Fat Cow presents her woeful Cow'ness mourning the loss of her youth. In younger days, she was Rubenesque, desired and salacious. Alas, those days are just misbegotten memories. Play-write Hillary Rollins takes us on this jocular ride, laced with musical humor. Moving on to the classics: Frozen Foods, by Ian August positions us in the supermarket's frozen foods aisle, while a woman, existentially contemplates our societal banality. Prepared, pasteurized and pathetic. Steve Yockey talks Telephones and Bad Weather,



set in a Climate Change induced storm of Biblical proportions.



The Presentation, Samantha has to give a presentation on sexual harassment... to a very unusual audience. Author Lia Romeo we hope hasn't experienced this social phenomenon. Forgotten Place, by Jeff Locker, tells of Eric, interviewing candidates for a Best Friend position. Concluding the program, Schrödinger's gun, what's in the briefcase, takes us inside physicist Erwin Schrödinger's cat in the box paradox, an up-to-the-minute gun awareness issue, by Greg A. Smith. The evening is presented in two acts, 4-plays each with a 15 minute intermission.

Audiences received a holiday gift in recent years, Winter Shorts! 2018 featured many whimsical holiday family and friends' interactions. Fruitcake anyone? 'Short Cuts', in partnership with Miami-Dade County Public Schools, tours 50 locations, themed towards bullying, getting along, and communications. 2018 introduced its first full-length production, Building the Wall, by Robert Schenkkan, part of National New Play Network's 'Rolling World Premiere'. 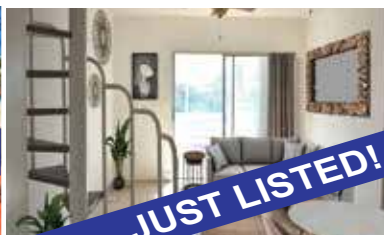

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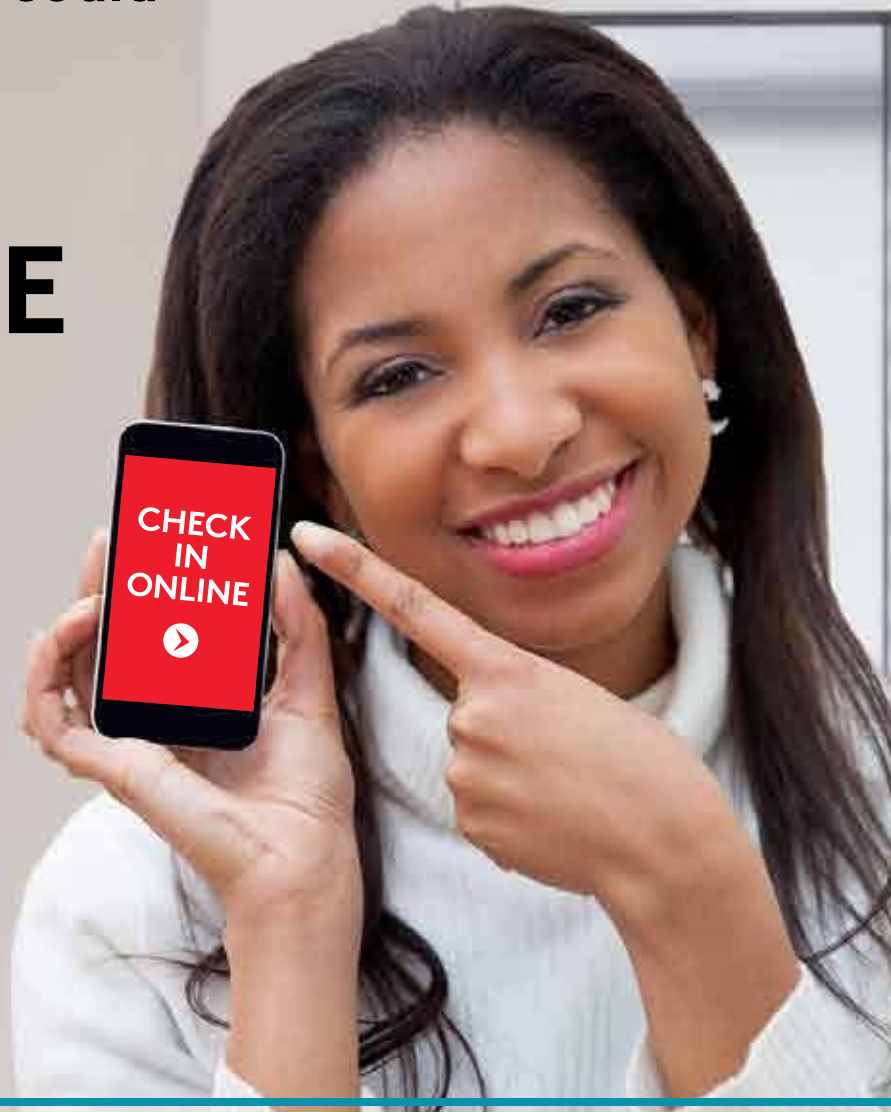
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
